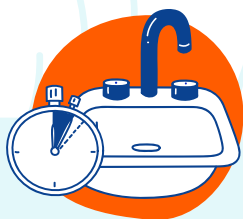

Kitchen tips



Save 1 litre by turning the tap off 10 seconds earlier



Save 14 litres per load by only running the washing machine full and on ECO mode



Save 20 litres by washing all of your fruit and vegetables in one go, rather than each time you need them

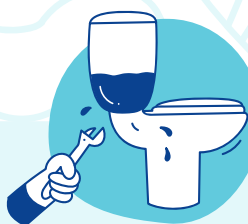


Save 10 litres a day by keeping a jug of water in the fridge instead of running the tap until cold

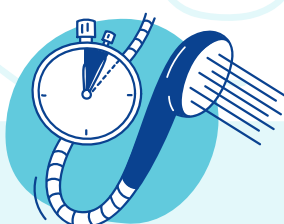


Save more water by using your dishwasher when full and on eco setting compared to washing up by hand

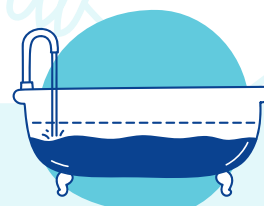
Bathroom tips



Save 400 litres every day by fixing a leaky loo [water running invisibly down the back of the pan]



Save up to 30 litres a day by spending just 2 minutes less in the shower



Save 10 litres per bath by filling it just 2 inches less than usual



Save 3 litres per flush by using just the small dual flush button, if you have one



Save 24 litres every day by turning off the tap while you brush your teeth

Garden tips



Save up to 200 litres by using a water butt to collect rainwater for your garden



Save up to 250 litres every car wash by using a bucket and sponge instead of a hose



Save 800 litres per hour by watering your garden with a watering can instead of a hose

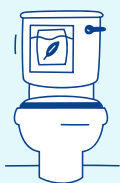


Reduce water lost to evaporation by watering your plants early in the morning or late evening



Save half of all water used by using a trigger-hose on your hosepipe so water only flows when you need it

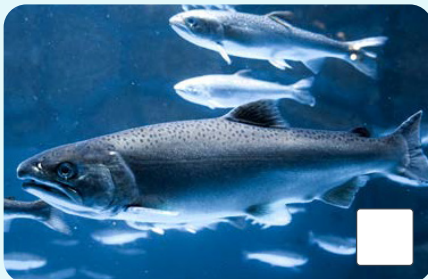

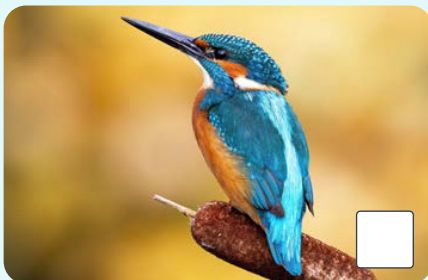

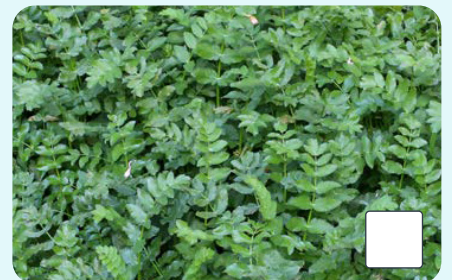
